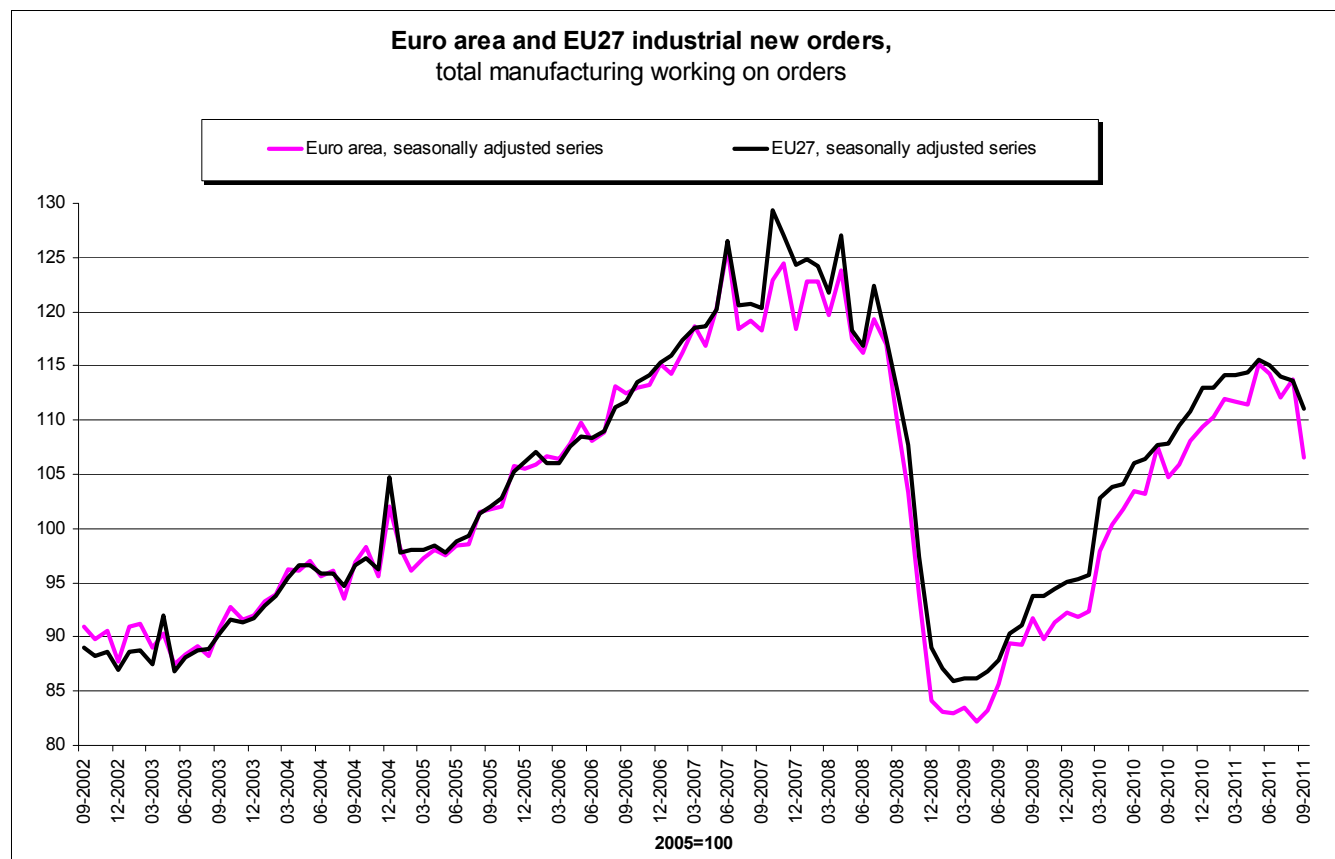
## Industrial new orders down by 6.4% in euro area

Down by 2.3% in EU27

In September 2011 compared with August 2011, the **euro area**<sup>1</sup> (EA17) industrial new orders index<sup>2</sup> fell by 6.4%. In August<sup>3</sup> the index rose by 1.4%. In the **EU27**<sup>1</sup> new orders decreased by 2.3% in September 2011, after a fall of 0.3% in August<sup>3</sup>. Excluding ships, railway & aerospace equipment<sup>4</sup>, for which changes tend to be more volatile, industrial new orders dropped by 4.3% in the **euro area** and by 2.1% in the **EU27**.

In September 2011 compared with September 2010, industrial new orders increased by 1.6% in the **euro area** and by 2.3% in the **EU27**. Total industry excluding ships, railway & aerospace equipment<sup>4</sup> rose by 2.5% and 3.5% respectively.

These estimates are released by **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**.



## Monthly comparison

In September 2011 compared with August 2011, new orders for capital goods fell by 6.8% in the **euro area** and by 2.1% in the **EU27**. Intermediate goods dropped by 3.2% and 2.1% respectively. Non-durable consumer goods declined by 2.0% in both zones. Durable consumer goods decreased by 0.6% in the **euro area**, but increased by 1.1% in the **EU27**.

Among the Member States for which data are available, total manufacturing working on orders fell in ten and rose in twelve. The largest decreases were registered in **Italy** (-9.2%), **Estonia** (-9.1%), **France** (-6.2%), **Spain** (-5.3%) and **Germany** (-4.4%), and the highest increases in **Denmark** (+14.0%), **Latvia** (+13.1%), **Poland** (+5.1%) and the **Czech Republic** (+4.8%).

## Annual comparison

In September 2011 compared with September 2010, new orders for intermediate goods rose by 3.1% in the **euro area** and by 3.9% in the **EU27**. Durable consumer goods increased by 1.3% in the **euro area**, but decreased by 3.4% in the **EU27**. Non-durable consumer goods gained 0.8% and 0.1% respectively. Capital goods grew by 0.6% in the **euro area** and by 2.4% in the **EU27**.

Among the Member States for which data are available, total manufacturing working on orders rose in eighteen and fell in the **Netherlands** (-4.8%), **Italy** (-4.3%), the **United Kingdom** (-3.4%) and **Ireland** (-1.6%). The highest increases were registered in **Latvia** (+37.7%), **Denmark** (+31.2%), **Lithuania** (+28.9%) and **Poland** (+18.0%).

1. The euro area (EA17) includes Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland.  
The EU27 includes Belgium (BE), Bulgaria (BG), the Czech Republic (CZ), Denmark (DK), Germany (DE), Estonia (EE), Ireland (IE), Greece (EL), Spain (ES), France (FR), Italy (IT), Cyprus (CY), Latvia (LV), Lithuania (LT), Luxembourg (LU), Hungary (HU), Malta (MT), the Netherlands (NL), Austria (AT), Poland (PL), Portugal (PT), Romania (RO), Slovenia (SI), Slovakia (SK), Finland (FI), Sweden (SE) and the United Kingdom (UK).
2. The new orders index measures the value of future deliveries of products and services (which are directly linked to these products) to be provided by a producer to a third party on the domestic and non-domestic market. The total manufacturing aggregate includes only those NACE levels required by the STS Regulation to be supplied by the Member States (NACE 13, 14, 17, 20, 21, 24 to 30) and is referred to as "total manufacturing working on orders". The euro area and EU aggregates normally do not include Member States for which no data is available.  
The seasonally adjusted euro area and EU series are calculated by aggregating the working day adjusted series for individual Member States and performing an adjustment for seasonal effects on these series. Therefore the seasonally adjusted figures for the European aggregates are based directly on the working day adjusted series for the Member States and **not on an aggregation of the seasonally adjusted indices from the Member States**. The euro area and EU seasonally adjusted growth rates might differ from the weighted growth rates of the individual Member States. This procedure also implies that the aggregation of the overall figures is not based on the published details.  
Working day adjusted data for Germany, Ireland, Spain, Latvia, Malta and Finland are calculated by the National Statistical Institutes of the corresponding Member States, using their own national calendar information. Working day adjusted data for all other Member States are calculated by Eurostat based on gross data provided by the Member States, using a standard calendar.  
Due to the volatility of industrial new orders, the figures can vary significantly from month to month and therefore short-term movements should be interpreted with caution.

3. Data of previous months have been revised compared with those issued in News Release 154/2011 of 24 October 2011. The monthly growth rates for August 2011 have been revised from +1.9% to +1.4% for the euro area and from +0.4% to -0.3% for the EU27. The annual growth rates have been revised from +6.2% to +5.9% for the euro area and from +6.5% to +6.0% for the EU27.
4. New orders for heavy transport equipment (NACE 30, which includes ships, railway and aerospace equipment) tend to be very volatile with a limited immediate impact on production. The aggregate "Manufacturing working on orders excluding heavy transport equipment" is less erratic. The share of heavy transport equipment in total manufacturing working on orders can be found in the document referred to in note no. 2.
